

THENCE CONTINUING NORTH 00°12'57" WEST1346.30 ALONG THE WEST LINE OF SAID NORTHEAST QUARTER OF T THE NORTHEAST QUARTER AND THE EAST LINE OF SAID GLENBROOK COVE FIFTH ADDITION T TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING.

WHEREAS, it is desirable that this area continue to be developed as an economic development project under the Urban Renewal Plan for the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa statutes require the City Council to submit the proposed Urban Renewal Plan for the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area to the Planning Commission for review and recommendation as to its conformity with the general plan for development of the community as a whole, prior to City Council approval of such Urban Renewal Project and the Urban Renewal Plan therefore; and

WHEREAS, the Urban Renewal Plan for the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area has been reviewed by the Planning Commission with the finding that the said Plan is in conformity with the general plan for the development of the City as a whole; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 0655-05-16 adopted on May 24, 2016, the City Council directed that a consultation be held with the designated representatives of all affected taxing entities to discuss the proposed Urban Renewal Plan for the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area and the division of revenue described therein, and that notice of said consultation and a copy of the proposed Urban Renewal Plan for the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area be sent to all affected taxing entities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to such notice, the consultation was duly held as ordered by the City Council and no written objections were made by any of the affected taxing entities and that the minutes of the said consultation meeting as set forth with Community Development Department are filed herewith and incorporated herein by this reference, for which no responses are necessary; and

WHEREAS, by said Resolution this Council also set a Public Hearing on the adoption of the proposed Urban Renewal Plan for the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area for this meeting of the Council, and due and proper notice of said Public Hearing was given, as provided by Law, by timely publication in the Cedar Rapids Gazette, which notice sets forth the time and place for this hearing and the nature and purpose thereof; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with said notice, all persons or organizations desiring to be heard on said proposed Plan, both for and against, have been given an opportunity to be heard with respect thereto and due consideration has been given to all comments and views expressed to this Council in connection therewith and said Public Hearing has been closed.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA as follows:

- 1. That the findings and conclusions set forth or contained in the proposed Urban Renewal Plan for the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area for the area of the City of Cedar Rapids, lowa legally described and depicted in the Plan and incorporated herein by reference (which area shall hereinafter be known as the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area), be and the same are hereby adopted and approved as the findings of this Council for this area.
- 2. That this Council further finds (a) there will be no displacement from the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area as a result of activities associated with implementation of the said Urban Renewal Plan; (b) the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area conforms to the general plan for

the development of the City as a whole; and (c) there are no areas of open land to be acquired by the City within the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area.

- 3. That the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area is an economic development area within the meaning of Iowa Code Chapter 403; that such area is eligible for designation as an Urban Renewal Area and otherwise meets all requisites under the provisions of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, and that the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, development, or a combination thereof, of such area is necessary and in the interest of the public health, safety, and welfare of the residents of this City.
- 4. That the Urban Renewal Plan for the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area, attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herewith by reference, be and the same is hereby approved and adopted as the Urban Renewal Plan for the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area and is hereby in all respects approved, and the City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of said Urban Renewal Plan for the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area with the proceedings of this meeting with the County Recorder for Linn County.
- 5. That the Urban Renewal Plan for the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area shall be in full force and effect from the date of this Resolution until the later of any date of termination set forth the Urban Renewal Plan for the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area or the date on which payment of all obligations issued or advances made to carry out the purposes thereof shall be fully provided for. Said Urban Renewal Plan for the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area shall be forthwith certified by the City Clerk and along with a copy of this Resolution, transmitted to the Recorder of Linn County, Iowa, to be filed and recorded in the manner provided by Law.

INTRODUCTION

This Urban Renewal Plan (the "Urban Renewal Plan") has been prepared by the City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa (the "City") to provide for the development of the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area (the "Project Area") of the City, and to stimulate, through public actions, financings and commitments, private investment in the urban renewal Project Area. In order to achieve these objectives, the City shall undertake the urban renewal actions specified in this Urban Renewal Plan, pursuant to the powers granted to it under Chapters 403 and 15A of the Code of Iowa, 2016, as amended (the "Code").

I. URBAN RENEWAL PLAN OBJECTIVES

The City has designated the Project Area as an "economic development area" as defined under Chapter 403. The primary objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan for the Project Area are as follows:

1. To stimulate through public action and commitment, private investment in new mixed-use commercial and residential development;

2. To plan and provide sufficient land for new and expanding private development;

3. To attract new businesses to the City and to encourage the expansion of existing City businesses;

4. To provide a more marketable and attractive investment climate through the use of various federal, state and local incentives;

5. To ensure that the Project Area is adequately served with public facilities, roadways, trails, utilities and services; and

6. To achieve a diversified, well-balanced economy providing a desirable standard of living, creating job opportunities for City residents and strengthening the property tax base of the City.

II. DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT AREA

The Project Area is an "urban renewal area" as defined in the Code and is located within the City of Cedar Rapids, Linn County, Iowa. The boundaries of the Project Area are illustrated on the Project Area Map attached hereto as Exhibit A.

The Project Area consists of an approximately 42 acres, in the City of Cedar Rapids, lowa and being described as follows:

PARCEL B, PLAT OF SURVEY NO. 958, AS RECORDED IN BOOK 4727, PAGE 120 JUNE 21, 2002 OF THE RECORDS OF THE LINN COUNTY, IOWA RECORDER, BEING A PART OF THE SE 1⁄4 SE 1⁄4 AND A PART OF SW 1⁄4 SW 1⁄4 , SECTION 2-83-7, LINN COUNTY, IOWA;

AND

THAT PART OF STATE HIGHWAY 100 DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:

BEGINNING AT THE INTERSECTION OF THE NORTH LINE OF PARCEL B, PLAT OF SURVEY NO. 958, AS RECORDED IN BOOK 4727, PAGE 120, JUNE 21, 2002 OF THE RECORDS OF THE LINN COUNTY, IOWA RECORDER AND THE WESTERLY RIGHT-OF-WAY LINE OF STATE HIGHWAY 100,

THENCE NORTHEASTERLY ALONG A PROJECTED BEARING OF SAID NORTH LINE OF PARCEL B, 354 FEET MORE OR LESS TO THE EAST RIGHT OF WAY LINE OF SAID STATE HIGHWAY 100,

THENCE SOUTHERLY ALONG THE EASTERLY RIGHT-OF-WAY OF SAID STATE HIGHWAY 100, 1090 FEET MORE OR LESS TO THE SOUTH LINE OF THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 1, TOWNSHIP 83, RANGE 7 WEST OF THE FIFTH PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN;

THENCE WEST ALONG THE SOUTH LINE OF THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 1, TOWNSHIP 83, RANGE 7 WEST OF THE FIFTH PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, 298 FEET MORE OR LESS TO THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 1, TOWNSHIP 83, RANGE 7 WEST OF THE FIFTH PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN;

BEGINNING AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF GLENBROOK COVE FIFTH ADDITION TO MARION, IOWA, SAID POINT ALSO BEING THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER OF SAID SECTION 11;

THENCE SOUTH 88°25'50" EAST 450.87 FEET ALONG THE NORTH LINE OF SAID NORTHEAST QUARTER OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER TO THE WEST LINE OF THE EASTERLY 880 FEET OF SAID SECTION 11;

THENCE SOUTH 00°14'52" EAST 1247.76 FEET ALONG THE WEST LINE OF THE EAST 880 FEET OF SAID SECTION 11 AND THE WEST LINE OF BEVER WOODS SECOND ADDITION TO CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA TO THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SAID BEVER WOODS SECOND ADDITION;

THENCE NORTH 88°44'54" WEST 109.87 FEET TO THE WEST LINE OF THE EAST 990 FEET OF SAID NORTHEAST QUARTER OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER;

THENCE SOUTH 00º08'10" WEST 93.17 FEET ALONG THE WEST LINE OF THE EAST 990 FEET OF SAID NORTHEAST QUARTER OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER TO THE NORTH LINE OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER;

THENCE NORTH 89°13'55" WEST 10.72 FEET ALONG THE NORTH LINE OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER TO THE EAST LINE OF THE WEST 330 FEET OF SAID SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER;

THENCE SOUTH 00°12'57" EAST 957.14 FEET ALONG SAID EAST LINE OF THE WEST 330 FEET TO THE SOUTH LINE OF THE NORTH 957 FEET OF SAID SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER;

THENCE NORTH 89°13'55" WEST 330.03 FEET ALONG THE SOUTH LINE OF SAID NORTH 957 FEET TO THE WEST LINE OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER;

THENCE NORTH 00°12'57" WEST 957.14 FEET ALONG THE WEST LINE OF SAID SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER AND THE EAST LINE OF PLAT OF SURVEY NO. 37 AND PART OF THE EAST LINE OF SAID GLENBROOK COVE FIFTH ADDITION, TO THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER;

THENCE CONTINUING NORTH 00°12'57" WEST1346.30 ALONG THE WEST LINE OF SAID NORTHEAST QUARTER OF T THE NORTHEAST QUARTER AND THE EAST LINE OF SAID GLENBROOK COVE FIFTH ADDITION T TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING.

III. PROJECT AREA ACTIVITIES

As a means of assisting in the development of the Project Area and fulfilling the objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan, the City may determine:

1. To undertake and carry out urban renewal project activities through the execution of contracts and other instruments;

2. To arrange for or cause to be provided the construction or repair of public infrastructure improvements, including street, water, sanitary sewer and storm sewer systems, traffic signals, and public utilities or other facilities in connection with urban renewal projects;

3. To acquire property through a variety of means (purchase, lease, exchange, condemnation, donation or otherwise) and to hold, clear or prepare the property for redevelopment;

4. To dispose of property so acquired (by sale, lease, exchange or otherwise) for purposes of private redevelopment;

5. To provide financing to pay a portion of the cost of construction of new facilities and developments;

6. To undertake or cause to be undertaken the construction of specific site improvements, such as grading and site preparation activities, access roads and parking, fencing, utility connections and related activities, in connection with the disposition of property;

7. To make loans or grants to private persons or businesses for economic development purposes on such terms as may be determined by the City Council;

8. To borrow money and provide security therefor;

9. To establish and enforce controls, standards and restrictions on land use and buildings;

10. To make or have made surveys and plans necessary for the implementation of the urban renewal program and specific urban renewal project activities;

11. To use tax increment financing to provide for necessary physical improvements and infrastructure, and to fund other urban renewal project costs; or

12. To use any and all other powers, without limitation, granted by the Code to develop and provide for improved economic conditions in the City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

IV. SPECIAL FINANCING ACTIVITIES

To meet the objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan and to encourage private investment in and the development of the Project Area, the City may determine to provide financial assistance to qualified private businesses through the making of loans or grants under Chapter 15A of the Code and through the use of tax increment financing under Chapter 403 of the Code.

A. <u>Chapter 15A Loans or Grants</u>. The making of loans or grants of public funds to private businesses within the Project Area may be deemed necessary or appropriate for economic development purposes (as defined in Chapter 15A of the Code) and to aid in the planning, undertaking and carrying out of urban renewal project activities authorized under this Urban Renewal Plan and the Code. Accordingly, in furtherance of the objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan, the City may determine to issue general obligation bonds, tax increment revenue bonds or other such obligations, or loan agreements for the purpose of making loans or grants of public funds to private businesses located in the Project Area. Alternatively, the City may determine to use available funds, including tax increment revenues from the Project Area, for making such loans or grants. In determining qualifications of recipients and whether to make any such individual loan or grant, the City shall consider, among other things, one or more of the factors set forth in Section 15A.1 of the Code on a case-by-case basis.

B. <u>Tax Increment Financing</u>. The City intends to utilize tax increment financing as a means to help pay for the costs associated with the development of the Project Area. General obligation bonds, tax increment revenue bonds or other such obligations or loan agreements may be issued by the City, and tax increment reimbursement may be sought for, among other things, the following costs (if and to the extent incurred by the City):

1. The construction of public improvements, such as streets, sanitary sewers, storm sewers, water mains, trails or sidewalks;

2. The funding of the "local match" required under State programs providing financial assistance to private developers; and

3. The making of loans or grants to private businesses under Chapter 15A of the Code, including debt service payments on any bonds or notes issued to finance such loans or grants.

Nothing herein shall be construed as a limitation on the power of the City to exercise any lawful power granted to the City under Chapter 15A, Chapter 403, Chapter 427B, or any other provision of the Code in furtherance of the objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan.

V. PROPERTY ACQUISITION

All of the properties located within the Project Area are privately owned and the City does not presently intend to acquire any land in the Project Area for purposes of private development. Areas may be identified for acquisition in the future for the following purposes:

1. To provide sites for needed private and public improvements or facilities in proper relationship to the projected demand for such facilities and in accordance with accepted criteria for the development of such facilities;

2. To assemble land into parcels of adequate size and shape to meet contemporary development needs and standards and to allow new construction to meet the objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan; or

3. To acquire any and all interests in any property within the Project Area which in any way dominates or controls usage of other real property proposed to be acquired.

VI. CLEARANCE AND DISPOSITION OF PROPERTY

All of the properties located within the Project Area are privately owned and the City does not presently intend to clear or dispose of property in the Project Area. If the City makes improvements in preparation for redevelopment or transfer of land to private developers, all improvements will be accomplished in accordance with the goals and objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan and in concert with other actions to ensure timely improvement of the land.

The City may advertise and solicit development proposals, may negotiate directly with prospective developers, and may dispose of all or a portion of any property acquired by it for the purpose of redevelopment in accordance with the goals and objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan. The property so disposed of may include vacated right-of-way and other lands under public ownership which are not needed for public purposes.

The City may subdivide, vacate or otherwise change the recorded arrangement of property under its control to accomplish the goals and objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan.

VII. LAND USE DEVELOPMENT

The planning criteria to be used to guide the physical development of the Project Area are those standards and guidelines contained within the City's Comprehensive Plan – EnvisionCR approved on January 27, 2015, as amended from time to time.

VIII. DEVELOPER REQUIREMENTS

In consideration of the efforts to be made by the City in furthering the development of the Project Area, developers who purchase land in the Project Area may be required to observe the land use requirements of this Urban Renewal Plan and to enter into a contractual agreement with the City in order to assure that the objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan are furthered or achieved.

Developers will not be permitted to defer the start of construction for a period longer than that required to prepare architectural plans, obtain satisfactory financing, and the review and approval of such plans by the City in order to establish their conformance with the provisions of this Urban Renewal Plan. In addition, it is expected that the following provisions will be included in agreements with developers:

1. Developers will submit plans and schedules for the proposed development to the City and will keep the City informed regarding progress on implementing these plans;

2. Any land purchased from the City can only be used for the purpose of development, and not for speculation;

3. Any ownership parcel made up in part of land acquired from the City will be built upon and improved in conformity with the objectives and provisions of this Urban Renewal Plan;

4. Construction of improvements will be initiated and completed within a reasonable time; and

5. There will be no discrimination against any person or group of persons on account of race, creed, color, national origin or ancestry in the sale, lease, sublease, transfer, use of enjoyment of the premises therein conveyed, nor will the developers themselves, or any claiming under or through them, establish or permit such practices of discrimination or segregation with respect to the selection, location, number, use or occupancy of tenants, lessees, or sub lessees in the premises therein conveyed.

The contract and other disposition documents to be executed by the developer will set forth, in detail, the provisions, standards and criteria for achieving the objectives and land use requirements established in this Urban Renewal Plan.

IX. PROJECT AND CITY INDEBTEDNESS

The City may agree to make economic development grants to the developer in consideration for certain employment commitments and other covenants expected to be made by the developer. As such, the eventual level of City participation in both private and public improvements for the economic development of the Project Area cannot be fully determined at this time. However, to the extent that new tax increment revenues are generated and other appropriate funding sources are identified, the City may undertake other project-related activities in the future.

At the present time, it is anticipated that future City tax increment collections for projectrelated activities within the Project Area will not exceed \$3,000,000.00 in aggregate amount during the term of this Urban Renewal Plan. Proceeds of such tax increment collections are currently expected to be used to make economic development grants to the developer and to reimburse the City for any other project-related costs incurred in connection with the development of the Project Area.

As of June 30, 2015, the City's outstanding general obligation indebtedness was \$315,200,000. Article XI, Section 3 of the Constitution of the State of Iowa limits the amount of

City debt outstanding at any time to no more than five percent (5%) of the value, as shown by the last certified state and City tax list, of all taxable property within the City. Based upon the actual value for fiscal year 2014/2015 (total actual value, less agriculture value that is not taxed for debt service) on all taxable property within the City of Cedar Rapids, the City is limited to \$490,817,852.00 of general obligation indebtedness.

X. STATE AND LOCAL REQUIREMENTS

All provisions necessary to conform to state and local law will be complied with by the City in implementing this Urban Renewal Plan and its supporting documents.

XI. SEVERABILITY

In the event one or more provisions contained in this Urban Renewal Plan shall be held for any reason to be invalid, illegal, unauthorized or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or lack of authorization or enforceability shall not affect any other provision of this Urban Renewal Plan, and this Urban Renewal Plan shall be construed and implemented as if such provisions had never been contained herein.

XII. AMENDMENT OF URBAN RENEWAL PLAN

This Urban Renewal Plan may be amended from time to time to respond to development opportunities. Any such amendment shall conform to the requirements of Chapter 403 of the Code. Any change affecting any property or contractual right will be effectuated only in accordance with applicable state and local law.

XIII. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Urban Renewal Plan shall be effective upon adoption by the City Council of the City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and shall remain in full force and effect until amended or rescinded by the City Council. However, the use of tax increment financing revenues (including the amount of Ioans, advances, indebtedness or bonds which qualify for payment from the division of revenue provided in Section 403.19 of the Code) by the City for activities carried out under this Urban Renewal Plan shall be limited as deemed appropriate by the City Council and consistent with all applicable provisions of law, including Iowa Code Section 403.17(10).

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THAT GENERAL PROPERTY TAXES ARE LEVIED AND COLLECTED EACH YEAR ON ALL PROPERTY LOCATED WITHIN THE GRAND LIVING URBAN RENEWAL AREA OF THE CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, COUNTY OF LINN, STATE OF IOWA, BY AND FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE STATE OF IOWA, CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, COUNTY OF LINN, LINN-MAR SCHOOL DISTRICT, CEDAR RAPIDS SCHOOL DISTRICT AND OTHER TAXING DISTRICTS, BE PAID TO A SPECIAL FUND FOR PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST ON LOANS, MONIES ADVANCED TO AND INDEBTEDNESS, INCLUDING BONDS ISSUED OR TO BE ISSUED, INCURRED BY SAID CITY IN CONNECTION WITH URBAN RENEWAL PROJECT ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN IN FURTHERANCE OF THE PLAN FOR THE GRAND LIVING URBAN RENEWAL AREA.

WHEREAS, the City Council, after public notice and hearing and as prescribed by law and pursuant to Resolution No. ______ passed and approved on the 28th day of June, 2016, adopted the Urban Renewal Plan (the "Urban Renewal Plan") for an urban renewal area known as the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Project Area") that includes lots and parcels located within the area described as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA, that:

Section 1: The taxes levied on the taxable property in the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area, legally described in Section 1 hereof, by and for the benefit of the State of Iowa, City of Cedar Rapids, County of Linn, Linn-Mar School District, Cedar Rapids School District, and all other taxing districts from and after the effective date of this Ordinance shall be divided as hereinafter in this Ordinance provided.

Section 2: That portion of the taxes which would be produced by the rate at which the tax is levied each year by or for each of the taxing districts upon the total sum of the assessed value of the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Project Area, as shown on the assessment roll as of January 1 of the calendar year preceding the first calendar year in which the City of Cedar Rapids certifies to the County Auditor of the amount of loans, advances, indebtedness, or bonds payable from the division of property tax revenue described herein (which certification is directed to be made during the 2016 calendar year), shall be allocated to and when collected be paid into the fund for the respective taxing district as taxes by or for the taxing district into which all other property taxes are paid (base year taxes).

Section 3: That portion of the taxes each year in excess of the base period taxes for the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area, shall be allocated to and when collected be paid into the special tax increment fund previously established by the City of Cedar Rapids to pay the principal of and interest on loans, monies advanced to, or indebtedness, whether funded, refunded, assumed or otherwise, including bonds issued under authority of Section 403.9 or Section 403.12 of the Code of Iowa, incurred by the City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa to finance or refinance, in whole or in part, urban renewal projects undertaken within the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area, except that taxes for the payment of bonds and interest of each taxing district shall be collected against all taxable property within the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area without any limitation as hereinabove provided.

Section 4: Unless or until the total assessed valuation of the taxable property in the areas of the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area exceeds the total assessed value of the taxable property in said areas shown by the assessment rolls referred to in Section 3 of this Ordinance, all of the taxes levied and collected upon the taxable property in the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts as taxes by or for the taxing districts in the same manner as all other property taxes.

Section 5: At such time as the loans, monies advanced, bonds and interest thereon and indebtedness of the City of Cedar Rapids referred to in Section 4 hereof have been paid, all monies thereafter received from taxes upon the taxable property in the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts in the same manner as taxes on all other property.

<u>Section 7</u>: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed. The provisions of this Ordinance are intended and shall be construed so as to continue the division of taxes from property within the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area under the provisions of Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa, as amended with respect to the division of taxes from property within the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area as described above. In the event that any provision of this Ordinance shall be determined to be contrary to law it shall not affect other provisions or application of this Ordinance which shall at all times be construed to fully invoke the provisions of Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa with reference to the Grand Living Urban Renewal Area and the territory contained therein.

<u>Section 8</u>: This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Background:

The City of Cedar Rapids has been a recipient of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding for over 40 years, and a participating jurisdiction in the HOME Investment Partnership Program since 1994. As a condition of receiving funds, the City is required to adopt, and follow, a Citizen Participation Plan that provides opportunities for public input on activities undertaken through the CDBG and HOME programs.

HUD recently adopted new requirements regarding what processes must be addressed in the Citizen Participation Plan, requiring the City to update its plan. As part of this work effort, staff undertook a comprehensive review of the Citizen Participation Plan to make administrative corrections and bring the plan into alignment with the operations of other boards and commissions, and to ensure compliance with all Federal, State, and Local Requirements.

The changes proposed generally fall into three categories:

- 1. Administrative changes, such as updating references to programs that have undergone name changes, bringing appointment procedures into alignment with other boards and commissions, aligning the timeline with the regular City Board and Commission appointment cycle, and clarifying how reasonable accommodations will be made to allow for full participation by people with disabilities.
- 2. Changes that are regulatory in nature and prescribed by HUD, specifically outlining a process for seeking citizen input on Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing and input on any substantial changes to the Consolidated Plan.
- 3. Changes that are regulatory in nature and intended to ensure compliance with State open meeting laws.

A matrix detailing the proposed changes is provided on an attached matrix.

Following the public hearing, City Council will have the opportunity to consider adopting of a resolution amending the Citizen Participation Plan. The amendments were reviewed by the Development Committee of City Council on May 18, 2016 and recommended for consideration by the full City Council. The goal is to have all amendments in place to in time to have appointed members attend the annual board and commission training sessions before the start of the new program budgeting cycle.

Action/Recommendation: City staff recommends holding the public hearing.

Alternative Recommendation: City Council may table and request additional information.

Time Sensitivity:

The last opportunity for City-wide board and commission training is anticipated to be in September. This timeline allows for all appointments to be in place prior to that training.

This project includes the rehabilitation of Memorial Drive SE from McCarthy Road to Mount Vernon Road. The work includes milling and resurfacing, water main replacement, and storm water improvements. The funds generated by the assessment will contribute to the costs of replacing bituminous fiber (Orangeburg) sanitary sewer service lines which serve individual houses along the project area.

When infrastructure construction by the City has benefited underdeveloped land, it has been the City's practice to charge adjacent lands for benefit they receive, via special assessment. If not assessed, the City is essentially financing development construction and increasing property value at the cost of taxpayers.

Refer to the attached flow chart of the Special Assessment process. The proposed Resolution of Necessity before City Council is the fourth resolution in a series of resolutions which will lead to an assessment public hearing (Step 5A on the flow chart). This resolution is in accordance with Iowa Code Section 384 for special assessments.

A public hearing is proposed for July 26, 2016 to receive public comments. Property owners in the assessment district will receive written notices of the project, proposed preliminary assessment amounts, and public hearing date. Following the public hearing, council will consider one of the following options:

- 1. Adopt the Resolution of Necessity as proposed and proceed with the project and special assessment.
- 2. Amend the preliminary assessments, then adopt the Resolution of Necessity and proceed with the project.
- 3. Defer action until a specified later date.
- 4. Abandon the special assessment.

Action/Recommendation:

The Public Works Department recommends adoption of the proposed Resolution of Necessity and setting of a public hearing on July 26, 2106 to receive public comments.





Description

This step initiates the special assessment process.

Council determines the value of the lot based upon the present fair market value with the proposed improvements in place.

This action proposes assessments, which become the basis of the public hearing. A proposed special assessment may not exceed 25% of the adopted lot valuation.

Public hearing must be advertised once each week for two consecutive weeks with the first publication not less than 10 days, nor more than 20 days before the hearing. City Clerk must mail certified letter to affected property owners not less than 15 days prior to public hearing.

This action is called the Resolution of Necessity, which has 4 options listed. This is the adoption of the preliminary assessment, which does not levy an assessment, but signifies an intent to levy in the future at a maximum level. The Council may not amend the assessments higher than that on which the public hearing was held. The preliminary assessment may be reduced at this step and/or at the post-construction final assessment stage.

Passage of the Resolution of Necessity is required by 75% of ALL Council members, whether present or not. If property owners representing 75% of the amount proposed to be assessed object, the Council passage vote must be unanimous by ALL Council members.







In June of 2008, WPCF was inundated by the largest flood in the history of Cedar Rapids. Immediately after the flood a joint effort was undertaken by city employees, contractors and consultants working together to get the plant operational. Emergency repairs were completed at a rapid pace throughout the facility to begin pumping and treating wastewater. While the Emergency Flood Repairs allowed WPCF to begin treating wastewater; the facility experienced significantly more reliability and redundancy problems after the flood. The Permanent Flood Repairs were designed to return the plant to pre-flood levels of redundancy and reliability. The Permanent Repairs - Package 1 (Main Lift pump station) project was previously completed in December 2011 by Rice Lake Construction Group. The Permanent Repairs - Package 2 (Solids Handling) project was completed in Fall 2012 by Staab Construction Corporation.

The Permanent Flood Repairs associated with these documents (Package 3) focused on flood damage at the Intermediate Lift, Final Lift, Unit Substations 3 & 7, Cryogenic Oxygen Generation Building, and activated sludge basins. Permanent replacement or repairs included process/mechanical equipment, pavement replacement, electrical components and wiring, and instrumentation and control components. (Flood Related)

There was one Change Order approved for this project in the amount of \$30,332.70.



The IDOT has approved the funding for the Kirkwood Boulevard SW and College Community School District (CCSD) South Access Drive Roundabout project. The bid letting will be held by the City of Cedar Rapids and the project will be administered by the City. The project consists of the construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Kirkwood Boulevard SW and CCSD South Access Drive and reconstruction of an undersized culvert on Hoosier Creek. The total estimated budget for the project is \$1,825,000 with approximately \$50,000 in assessments for new sidewalks. The project is budgeted from the Tech Park TIF district. Resolution No. 1120-07-15 authorized applying for a Traffic Safety Improvement Program (TSIP) grant July 28, 2015. College Community School District passed a resolution of support for the project at school board meeting as part of the grant application process.

A traffic study was completed as part of the grant application process. The traffic study recommends a roundabout as the best remediation for the intersection of Kirkwood Blvd SW and South Access Dr. The study found that the intersection does not meet the warrants for a signal. An all-way stop was considered, but would increase delay. A roundabout would allow for a free-flowing intersection as well as provide increased safety.

Currently College Community School District requires a City of Cedar Rapids police officer at this intersection before and after school. The proposed roundabout will eliminate the need to have a police officer at the intersection before and after school.

Action/Recommendation:

The Public Works Department recommends approving the resolution authorizing execution of an Agreement between the IDOT and the City of Cedar Rapids for the Kirkwood Boulevard SW and College Community School District (CCSD) South Access Drive Roundabout project.





The work consists of repairing service lines, corporation stops, and resetting or relocating curb boxes within the public right-of-way from the City main to and including the first shut-off valve located within the public right-of-way.

Each year, Water Division staff estimates the amount of service work that will be needed for the coming year. The estimates are based on a review and analysis of recent years' activity and costs. Due to the nature of this type of work, it is difficult to anticipate the work that will be needed. Each work request is in response to unanticipated failures in equipment or materials, e.g., leaking service lines or broken stop boxes. For FY17 the estimated cost for the repairs is \$300,000.

Only one (1) bid was received on June 15, 2016 for the Repair of Water Service Lines FY 17 project (Contract No. 521108-17).

EnvisionCR Element/Goal: StrengthenCR Goal 4: Create a city that is affordable and accessible to all members of the community.

Background:

The Resolution authorizes City participation in the proposed The Gardens senior housing project proposed by Stone Creek Senior Partners LLC contingent on establishing an Urban Renewal Area and negotiation of a Development Agreement. The site of the proposed senior housing project is on 14 acres at the corner of Dean Rd and Stone Creek Circle SW.

The project consists of the construction of an approximately 73,000 square foot senior housing facility which provides skilled nursing care, memory care, assisted living units. The Developer has received licensure from the State for skilled units. Highlights of the proposed project are as follows:

- \$15 million investment
- 82 units residential (skilled nursing (40), memory care (12), assisted living(30))
- Creation of new jobs
 - o 80 full-time employees
 - o 20 or more jobs meeting the State's High Quality Jobs wage threshold
 - o \$2.5 million in annual wages estimated

The City received a request from Stone Creek Senior Partners LLC for participation in the project under the City's Community Benefit – Economic Development Program. The community benefits provided by the proposed project include:

- Job creation;
- Providing housing option for seniors;
- First construction of new skilled nursing units since 1992;
- Meeting a need for community demographic;

Staff is recommending providing City support of 4-years, 50% of the increase in taxes generated by the improvements consistent with similar project recently support by the Council. This proposed participation bridges the gap to keep property tax expenses consistent until the multi-residential rollback is in full effect beginning with the 2022 assessment year. The City's participation would cease when the multi-residential rollback equalizes with the residential rollback rate.

The proposed project is estimated to generate approximately \$2.1 million in total taxes over 10years based on a post-development assessed value of \$8.7 million. The City's reimbursement of 50% of the increased taxes over 4-years is estimated to reimburse \$361,200 back to the Developer.

If the City Council approves the Resolution, staff will initiate the proceedings to establish an Urban Renewal Area starting the July 12 City Council meeting. Additionally, a Development Agreement would be presented to the City Council at a later meeting.

Background:

The Cedar Rapids Municipal Code authorizes the City Clerk to issue certain licenses and permits as may be provided in said code. Fees are charged to capture the costs of providing said licenses and permits and such costs should be paid by the recipient of said licenses and permits. Currently, some sections of the Municipal Code provide for fees to be set by Ordinance and other provisions provide for fees to be set by Resolution. It would be more efficient if all fees for licenses and permits that are issued by the City Clerk be set by City Council Resolution.

This proposed Ordinance will amend the Municipal Code by removing the reference to fees in various code sections and replacing it with language which states that license or permit fees will be set by City Council Resolution. This amendment will clarify fees and create consistency as to how fees are set and revised.

All fees for licenses and permits issued by the City Clerk will need to be restated and approved by Resolution, and will be placed on the June 28 agenda.

Action/Recommendation:

AN ORDINANCE ALLOWING FEES FOR LICENSES AND PERMITS ISSUED BY THE CEDAR RAPIDS CITY CLERK TO BE SET BY CITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code authorizes the City Clerk to issue certain licenses and permits as may be provided in said code; and

WHEREAS, fees are charged to capture the costs of providing said licenses and permits and such costs should be paid by the recipient of said licenses and permits; and

WHEREAS, some parts of the City Code provide for fees to be set by Ordinance and other provisions provide for fees to be set by Resolution and it would be more efficient if all fees for licenses and permits that are issued by the City Clerk be set by City Council Resolution and the City Code should be amended accordingly.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CEDAR RAPIDS CITY COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. Chapter 41 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code is hereby amended by deletion of Section 41.03 entitled "Payment of Fee" and a new Section 41.03 is hereby enacted in its place as follows:

"41.03 – Payment of Fees.

Unless otherwise provided, license fees shall be paid as established by a schedule of fees adopted from time to time by resolution of the City Council."

<u>Section 2</u>. Chapter 42 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code is hereby amended by deletion of Section 42.14 entitled "Fees" and a new Section 42.14 is hereby enacted in its place as follows:

"42.14 – Fees.

Unless otherwise provided, license fees shall be paid as established by a schedule of fees adopted from time to time by resolution of the City Council."

<u>Section 3</u>. Chapter 43 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code is hereby amended by deletion of Section 43.02 entitled "License Fees" and a new Section 43.02 is hereby enacted in its place as follows:

"43.02 – License Fees.

Unless otherwise provided, license fees shall be paid as established by a schedule of fees adopted from time to time by resolution of the City Council."

<u>Section 4</u>. Chapter 44 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code is amended by deletion of Section 44.04 entitled "Classes of Licenses and Fees" and a new Section 44.04 is hereby enacted in its place as follows:

"44.04 – Classes of Licenses and Fees.

Classes of auctioneers' licenses, and the fees for each class of license shall be as established from time to time by resolution of the City Council."

<u>Section 5</u>. Chapter 45 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code is hereby amended by deletion of Section 45.05 entitled "License Fees" and a new Section 45.05 is hereby enacted in its place as follows:

"45.05 – License Fees.

Unless otherwise provided, license fees shall be paid as established by a schedule of fees adopted from time to time by resolution of the City Council."

<u>Section 6</u>. Chapter 49 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code is amended by deletion of Section 49.03 entitled "License Fees" and a new Section 49.03 is hereby enacted in its place as follows:

"49.03 – License Fees.

"(a) The license fee for conducting a public dance hall or giving a public dance shall be as established from time to time by resolution of the City Council."

"(b) No special dance license or single dance license shall be issued for public dances or public dancing in connection with any place where alcoholic beverages are sold, offered for sale, served or dispensed. However, any organized, bona fide club, fraternal organization, or society may make application for a special license or single dance license to hold a public dance on its premises at a particular time upon payment of a special license fee as established from time to time by resolution of the City Council."

<u>Section 7</u>. Chapter 51 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code is amended by deletion of Section 51.08 entitled "License and Permit Fees" and new Section 51.08 is hereby enacted in its place as follows:

"51.08 – License and Permit Fees.

License and permit fees will be as established by applicable state law. To the extent allowed by applicable state law, any other license and permit fees may be established from time to time by resolution of the City Council."

<u>Section 8</u>. All previous license or permit fees charged and collected by the City Clerk whether by ordinance or resolution are hereby declared to be ratified, authorized, and legally assessed by and paid to the City.

<u>Section 9</u>. It is the intention of the Council that each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, and provision of the Ordinance is separable, and, if any provision is held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance nor any part thereof than that affected by such decision.

Section 10. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed.

<u>Section 11</u>. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
