On July 26, 2016 the City Council adopted a Resolution of Support authorizing sponsorship of an application to the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA) for state funds and authorizing the required local match participation through and Urban Revitalization Tax Exemption (URTE).

ReConserve is requesting City sponsorship of a Business Financial Assistance Application to the State of Iowa to assist the company in the construction of a new 61,000 square foot industrial facility located near the intersection of 60th Ave SW and Edgewood Rd SW. ReConserve was previously located in rural Linn County until a fire destroyed its facility in October 2015.

Project Details:

- New 61,000 sq. ft. industrial facility
- \$12.3 Million total Capital Investment

This project qualifies for the City's Local Match Program which would leverage \$244,800 in in tax credits through the State's High Quality Jobs program. The partial tax exemption is a tenyear, declining scale exemption averaging 44% per year, applied only to the increased property valuation. Upon the completion of the project, the 10-year City incentive provided under the URTE is as follows:

- \$995,700 in total tax revenues collected over a 10-year period
- \$585,300 deferred as tax exempt over a 10-year period.

ReConserve processes grain-based food waste products such as bread, cereal, cookies, crackers, chips, and pasta, into registered feed ingredients for livestock feed. As a post-production processing company, ReConserve works with multiple local food manufacturers as a value-added industry.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the formation of the Urban Revitalization Tax Exemption Area and Plan is to encourage and induce the construction of a new 61,000 square foot commercial and industrial facility and all related site improvements. As allowed by the authority of the State of Code of lowa, Chapter 404, the incentive for economic development through business expansion is provided by exempting a portion or all of property tax valuation added through qualified improvements for specified periods of time.

2.0 DESCRIPTION OF THE URBAN REVITALIZATION AREA

The area to be designated within the Urban Revitalization Tax Exemption Area is described and depicted on **Exhibit A** and is approximately 10 acres in size. The revitalization is applicable to all of the property assessed as agricultural, commercial and industrial located within the Plan area.

3.0 OWNERSHIP AND ASSESSED VALUATION

The Urban Revitalization Area, as specified in the legal description above, consists of a portion of the following parcel:

4.0 PROGRAM ACTIVITY

4.1 Land Use and Zoning

The current property is zoned I-2, General Industrial zone district. The proposed construction of a new industrial facility for use as a bio-processing facility is consistent with the City's Comprehensive Plan, EnvisionCR, which designates the project area as Employement Reserve (ER) which includes uses such as heavy industrial, light industrial and manufacturing.

4.2 City Services

The area is located within the City's corporate limits and within current service areas for street maintenance, police and fire. As a commercial facility, the property would be served by private garbage collection services. City infrastructure, including potable water, sanitary sewer, storm sewer, and public street network is accessible to the site and adequately sized to serve the area. Other private utilities, electric and gas, are located adjacent to the site and available for access and development of the area.

4.3 Applicable Property

This Plan, and the tax exemption allowed herein, is applicable to new construction and related site improvements and applies to commercial, industrial and agricultural classifications with the Plan area. Any improvements on land assessed as agricultural land as described herein will utilize only the minimum amount of agricultural land necessary to accomplish the proposed revitalization of the other classes of property within the ReConserve of lowa, Inc. Urban Revitalization Area.

Any additional development or expansion within the property described in Section 2.0 of this Plan may be eligible for the tax exemption allowed herein, based upon the review and approval of the City of Cedar Rapids City Council. A written request by the developer must be reviewed to ensure consistency with the City Council goals of creating/retaining high quality jobs, significant increase in property valuation, infrastructure connectivity, and expansion of target industries.

5.0 DURATION OF THE URBAN REVITALIZATION PLAN

The Urban Revitalization Project shall remain so designated for a period of no less than one year from the date of this first approval by the City Council of the City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa. When, in the opinion of the City Council, the desired level of revitalization has been attained or economic conditions are such that the continuation of the exemption granted by the Urban Revitalization Act would cease to be of benefit to the City, the City Council may repeal the Ordinance establishing the Revitalization Area. In such an event, all existing tax exemptions shall continue until their expiration pursuant to the Urban Revitalization Act.

6.0 PROCEDURES FOR CHANGES IN THE APPROVED PLAN

Adjustments or modifications of this approved Plan, resulting from experience during project execution, are authorized in the administration of this project, provided that the intent of this approved Plan is not changed. Specifically, these changes may include:

- revisions to the Urban Revitalization Area boundary;
- eligible projects;
- tax exemption schedules;
- relocation payments, if other than that required under the Urban Revitalization Act, Chapter 404 of the Code of Iowa.

7.0 REVENUE BONDS

The City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, may issue revenue bonds as provided under the Urban Revitalization Act for improvement projects within the Revitalization Area. Revenue bonds may be issued for all, or any part, of any interest in land, buildings, or improvements which are suitable for the use of a commercial enterprise or non-profit organization which the City Council finds is consistent with the approved Urban Revitalization Plan.

8.0 TAX EXEMPTION PROGRAM

8.1 **Procedures**

A property owner may submit a proposal for a revitalization improvement project to the City Council in order to receive prior approval for eligibility for tax exemption under this project. The City Council may, by Resolution, give its prior approval for an improvement project if the project is in conformance with the Revitalization Plan. This prior approval does not entitle the property owner to exemption from taxation until the improvements have been completed and found to be qualified real estate. If the proposal is not approved, the property owner may submit an amended proposal for City Council consideration.

An application must be filed for each new exemption claimed. In order to qualify for a tax exemption under this Plan, an <u>Application for Revitalization Tax Exemption</u> (the "Application") accompanied by a report of the total must be filed with the City Clerk between January 1 and February 1 in the year after the improvements requested for exemption have been completed. The Application is then reviewed by appropriate City departments and a determination made that the improvements located in and are in conformance with this Plan, and that the improvements made increased the actual assessed valuation of the property by at least the minimum percentage required under the Urban Revitalization Act, and the improvements were made during the time the area was designated as a Revitalization Area. If approved, the City Assessor shall continue to grant the tax exemption for the time period specified in the tax exemption schedule elected by the property owner.

8.2 Tax Exemption Schedules

8.2.1 Schedule 1 - Residential Exemption:

All qualified real estate assessed as residential property is eligible to receive an exemption from taxation based on the actual value added by the improvements, determined as follows: One hundred fifteen percent of the value added by the improvements. However, the amount of the actual value added by the improvements which shall be used to compute the exemption shall not exceed twenty thousand dollars and the granting of the exemption shall not result in the actual value of the qualified real estate being reduced below the actual value on which the homestead credit is computed under § 425.1.

8.2.2 Schedule 2 - Ten Year Declining Exemption:

All qualified real estate is eligible to receive a portion exemption from taxation on the actual value added by the improvements for a 10-year period. The amount of the partial exemption is equal to a percentage of the property taxes generated by the actual value added by those improvements as follows:

8.2.3 Schedule 3 - Three Year Exemptions:

All qualified real estate is eligible to receive a one hundred percent (100%) exemption from taxation on the actual value added by qualified improvements for three years.

8.2.4 Schedule 4 - 10-Year Qualified Residential Exemption:

All qualified real estate assessed as residential property or assessed as commercial property, if the commercial property consists of three or more separate living quarters with at least seventy-five percent of the space used for residential purposes, is eligible to receive a one hundred percent exemption from taxation on the actual value added by the improvements. The exemption is for a period of ten years.

8.2.5 Election of Schedule:

The property owner of qualified real estate eligible for an exemption shall elect to use one of the schedules identified above. Once the election of schedule has been made and the exemption granted, the property owner is not permitted to change the exemption schedule.

8.3 **Definitions**

(a) "Qualified Business or Other Non-Residential Tenant" shall mean the legal occupant of a building or part thereof and conducting a business or non-residential operation which is located within the designated Revitalization Area and who has occupied the same premises continuously since one year prior to the adoption of this Plan. (b) "Qualified Real Estate" shall mean real property, other than land, which is located in this Revitalization Area and to which improvements have been added during the time of the area was so designated, which have increased the actual value by at least fifteen percent (15%) or at least ten percent (10%), in the case of land upon which is located more than one building (and not assessed as residential property) increased the actual value of the buildings to which the improvements have been made.

"Qualified Real Estate" also means land upon which no structure existed at the start of new construction, which is located in this Revitalization Area and upon which new construction has been added during the time the area was designated as a Revitalization Area.

(c) "Improvements" includes rehabilitation and additions to existing structures as well as new construction on vacant land or on land with existing structures.

9.0 RELOCATION

The property eligible as Qualified Real Estate is vacant, unoccupied land; relocation is not anticipated as part of the project.

Background:

The request for a Rezoning with a Preliminary Site Development Plan was reviewed by the City Planning Commission on April 21, 2016. 





Background:

Boyson Road currently is heavily traveled with 20,000 vehicles per day using the Boyson Road interchange at I-380. The City of Hiawatha and IDOT are reviewing the proposed Tower Terrace Interchange at I-380 for the third time. The Interchange Justification Report required Hiawatha to improve North Center Point Road and Boyson Road before a Tower Terrace Interchange could be considered. Hiawatha is reconstructing the last section of Center Point Road and is ready to partner with IDOT to begin design work for the Boyson Road at I-380 Interchange this fall with funding available. If the Tower Terrace Interchange was built prior to the reconstruction of the Boyson Road Interchange, then Tower Terrace could be utilized as a vital roadway, shifting the Boyson Road traffic to the Tower Terrace road system while the Boyson Road Interchange was under construction.

Construction of a Tower Terrace Road Interchange at I-380 will provide improved traffic operations on Blairs Ferry Road and Boyson Road in the City of Cedar Rapids.

During county and metro meetings, it was decided the communities would provide 25%, or \$5,000,000, of the \$20,000,000 estimated cost for the Tower Terrace Interchange at I-380 project. A 20% match is required for federal funding. A joint application was submitted to our Corridor MPO requesting \$4,000,000 of federal aid funding, with another \$1,000,000 local match divided in fifths between the metro and county entities. Cedar Rapids match for the Tower Terrace Interchange is \$200,000.

Action/Recommendation:

The Public Works Department recommends approval of the I-380 Interchange at Tower Terrace Road Letter of Support and participation of \$200,000 as the match to the Tower Terrace Interchange Project.







- 4. No windows signs or "For Sale" or "For Rent" signs will be allowed unless approved by the Developer and the City.
- 5. No portable flashing, moving lights or exposed tubular type signs shall be permitted.
- Any additional parcels contiguous to the Northtowne Market Development rezoned to the PUD-1, Planned Unit Development One Zone District shall be subject to these sign regulations.
- 7. Any requested variances to these sign regulations shall be reviewed and acted upon by the City's Board of Adjustment.



Background:

As part of the Cedar River Flood Control System (FCS), levees, walls, gates and pump stations will be constructed to protect the both the east and west banks of the Cedar River from flooding similar to that which was seen in 2008. The City Council adopted the Cedar River FCS Master Plan on June 23, 2015, which includes this levee segment.

This levee in this project will run from the south property line of the African American Museum to Alliant's River Run substation, with a gap at 16th Avenue SW for a future gate structure, and encompassing all of the former Sinclair Meatpacking site. The levee will average approximately 13 feet high. A paved 12 foot wide trail will be on top from 16th Avenue to the south. Interior drainage (dry side of the levee) will be handled with a combination of detention basin and pump station. Masaryk Park will be effectively removed by the new levee and the monuments and green space will be re-situated in a future phase.

This bid package is the second of three phases of a \$14 million project, with \$11.3 million in CDBG Disaster Recovery funds. The first construction contract, encompassing levee and walls, was awarded by City Council in August 2016. Both the first contract and this second contract are scheduled for completion in fall 2017. The third phase is environmental remediation on the Sinclair site, also scheduled for 2017, and which will allow for expansion of the detention basin to provide ultimate resiliency per the FCS Master Plan. Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA), which administers the CDBG funds, has concurred in releasing all construction contracts for bid.

Action/Recommendation:

The Public Works Department recommends approval of the Motion filing plans, specifications, form of contract, estimated costs, setting a public hearing date for the Sinclair Levee – Pump Station and Detention Basin Project and advertising for bids by posting notice to bidders for the project.



- 1. Applicant requests the following streets to be closed for the event:
 - 7th Avenue SE from 5th Street SE to 6th Street SE
 - 5th Street SE from 7th Avenue SE to the north ROW line of the alley between 7th Avenue SE and 8th Avenue SE

In case of a construction project, route may need to be revised; Traffic Engineering will work with the applicant.

- 2. For traffic and pedestrian safety purposes, the City Traffic Engineering Division will approve temporary "No Parking" signs, meeting City specifications, to be placed along the following streets for this event:
 - 7th Avenue SE from 5th Street SE to 6th Street SE
 - 5th Street SE from 7th Avenue SE to the north ROW of the Alley between 7th Avenue SE and 8th Avenue SE
 - a. The appropriate signs, as specified by the Traffic Engineering Division, will be installed, maintained and removed by an insured traffic control contractor that will be hired and paid by Applicant. Signs shall be stake mounted and a minimum size of 24" X 18", spaced at a maximum distance of 75' apart on all listed streets.

- C Street SW from 12th Avenue SW to 16th Avenue SW
- 7th Street SE from 10th Avenue SE to 15th Avenue SE
- 9th Street SE from 10th Avenue SE to 12th Avenue SE
- 10th Avenue SE from 9th Street SE to 7th Street SE

Unless specified, rolling closures for the course route from 8 AM to 11 AM

WHEREAS, the event includes a 5K run and one mile walk with the route as follows:

The 5K route:

Start at 10th Street SE and 6th Avenue SE, continue southeast on 10th Street SE to Mt Vernon Road SE, turn east on Mt Vernon Road SE to 15th Street SE, turn south on 15th Street SE to 12th Avenue SE, turn east on 12th Avenue SE to 16th Street SE, turn south on 16th Street SE to 15th Avenue SE, turn west on 15th Avenue SE to 7th Street SE, turn northwest on 7th Street SE to 12th Avenue SE, turn northeast on 12th Avenue SE to 9th Street SE, turn northwest on 9th Street SE to 10th Avenue SE, turn southwest on 10th Avenue SE to 7th Street SE, turn southeast on 7th Street SE to 12th Avenue SE, turn southwest on 12th Avenue SE, turn southeast on 4th Street SE to 16th Avenue SE, turn southwest on 16th Avenue SE and continue to the Bridge of Lions (16th Avenue Bridge) crossing the bridge to 16th Avenue SW and continuing on 16th Avenue SW to C Street SW, turn northwest on C Street SW to 12th Avenue SW, turn northeast on 12th Avenue SW and continue to the 12th Avenue Bridge crossing the bridge and continuing on 12th Avenue SE to the finish just northeast of 2nd Street SE.

Family Fun Walk:

Start at 10th Street SE and 6th Avenue SE, continue southeast on 10th Street SE to 9th Avenue SE, turn southwest on 9th Avenue SE to 6th Street SE, turn southeast on 6th Street SE to 12th Avenue SE, turn southwest on 12th Avenue SE to 3rd Street SE and the finish.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA, that the request is approved subject to the following conditions:

- 1. If food is served and/or sold at the event, the applicant (or vendors) shall meet all applicable requirements of the Linn County Health Department and the City Code.
- 2. Applicant has requested a banner be on the Mt Vernon Road SE pedestrian overpass, applicant shall meet any additional requirements of the City concerning, but not limited to;
 - The banner be placed on the pedestrian overpass before the start of the race and taken done after the runners/walkers have passed and before Mt Vernon Road SE/8th Avenue SE/10th Street SE is opened.
 - The banner shall be placed on the inside of the pedestrian overpass.
- 3. Applicant will be responsible for contacting both the Union Pacific Railroad and the Cedar Rapids & Iowa City Railway to assure no conflicts will occur during the event at any railroad grade crossings that intersect with the race routes.
- 4. Applicant's insured traffic control contractor shall provide all barricades/traffic controls required by the City for the temporary street closure. All barricades/traffic controls must conform to the requirements of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. Applicant shall provide the name and phone number of the company providing the barricades/traffic controls to the Police Department and Traffic Engineering a minimum of one week prior to the event.

5. Regarding the use of tents, stages, etc. on public property:

Applicant shall adhere to City guidelines established for items requiring supports and/or restraints:

- a. Applicant shall obtain City approval before any drilling, excavation, or construction is begun on City property. Applicant shall initiate advance contact with Public Works Department to provide exact locations of any potential new holes on public property prior to drilling.
- b. Applicant shall contact lowa One Call, well in advance of the event, for all underground utility locations relative to any required drilling.
- c. Applicant shall utilize the same holes previously drilled in street and sidewalk surfaces (both asphalt and concrete) for all support and restraint devices when possible.
- d. Applicant shall contact Public Works Department for details of required post event treatment of surfaces. Applicant shall complete required post event treatment of all areas of drilling, excavation, or construction.

 - 6th Street SE from 9th Avenue SE to 12th Avenue SE
 - 12th Avenue SE from 15th Street SE to 16th Street SE
 - 7th Street SE from 10th Avenue SE to 15th Avenue SE
 - 10th Avenue SE from 7th Street SE to 9th Street SE
 - 9th Street SE from 10th Avenue SE to 12th Avenue SE
 - C Street SW from 12th Avenue SW to 14th Avenue SW
 - 16th Avenue from 4th Street SE to C Street SW
 - 3rd Street SE from 9th Avenue SE to 16th Avenue SE
 - 11th Avenue SE from 2nd Street SE to 4th Street SE
 - 16th Street SE from 12th Avenue SE to 15th Avenue SE
 - a) The appropriate signs, as specified by the Traffic Engineering Division, will be installed, maintained and removed by an insured traffic control contractor that will be hired and paid by Applicant. Signs shall be stake mounted and a minimum size of 24" X 18", spaced at a maximum distance of 75' apart on all listed streets.
 - b) The temporary "No Parking" signs shall be installed by the traffic control contractor no earlier than Saturday, October 8, 2016, and removed no later than Monday, October 10, 2016.
 - c) The Applicant shall provide advance written notification to adjacent property owners on the above named streets of the event dates and times and the temporary "No Parking" posting. A copy of the notice shall be provided to the Traffic Engineering Division prior to the event.

- 7. Applicant shall provide written notification, a minimum of 48 hours before the event, to all affected property owners adjoining the barricaded street closures and/or temporary no parking, (to help minimize traffic conflicts between motorists and race participants). Written notification shall include information on the event including event route, event date, start and finish times, and the name and telephone number of the Applicant's contact person. A copy of this written notification shall be provided to the City Manager's Office.
- 8. Participants shall observe all traffic control devices and traffic regulations unless otherwise directed by a uniformed police officer.
- 9. Applicant shall comply with all existing parking regulations on all adjacent areas of public property.
- 10. Applicant shall provide adequate restroom facilities including ADA accessible restrooms (5% or no less than 1).
- 11. Applicant shall provide adequate adult volunteers at all intersections and other locations to assist with walk event instructions, event monitoring, and event participant safety. Volunteers are NOT authorized to direct vehicular traffic at any time.
- 12. Applicant shall be responsible for receiving from each participant in the run/walk an individual signed Waiver of Liabilities of the City of Cedar Rapids.
- 13. Applicant agrees that any pavement markings or signage required for this event will be done with prior approval of the City Traffic Engineering Division, and no permanent markings of any type will be permitted. Any signage and/or markings used must be removed immediately following the event.
 - a) Sidewalk chalk is acceptable for chalk art on public sidewalks OTHER THAN sidewalks in and adjacent to City parks.
 - b) Chalk paint shall not be applied to any city street or sidewalk.
- 14. Applicant will supply trash bags and receptacles and is responsible for removing all associated trash from city property. Any cost associated with clean up done by the City will be billed to the applicant.
- 15. Traffic Engineering Contact Information: For questions related to road closure or temporary no parking signs after hours and on weekends, contact number is 319 360 1144.
- 16. Applicant shall obtain approvals from private property owners, appropriate utility companies, Park CR, Parks Department and Cedar Rapids Metro Economic Alliance for ribbon attachment at the various locations on the route, beginning Monday, September 26th, 2016 through Friday, October 21, 2016. Applicant agrees to remove all ribbons after the event.
- 17. The attached ribbons shall not extend longer than two feet at any time, or extend into or over public streets, sidewalks, trails, etc. for public safety reasons.
- 18. Applicant and participants shall not attach ribbons to any traffic signal, traffic signal support, traffic control sign or traffic control sign support, including but not limited to stop signs, yield signs, speed limit signs, parking signs and construction signs.

- 19. Applicant shall contact the Cedar Rapids Police Department at least 15 to 30 days prior to the event to hire off duty police officers, as required by the Police Department to attend barricades at street closures, to assist with traffic control at designated intersections, and for event security. Contact Sgt. Mark Andries (286 5438) to arrange officers. The Police Department will provide the off duty officer contact name and cell number to applicant prior to the event.
 - Applicant will be required to hire twenty nine (29) officers and one (1) commander.
 - Three (3) officers (\$49/hr) six (6) hours, \$882
 - Twenty six (26) officers \$49/hr), three (3) hours, \$3,822
 - One (1) commander (\$54/hr), four hours, \$216
 - Estimated total is \$4,920
- 20. Applicant shall contact the City Public Works Department to provide advance notice regarding any crane or other heavy equipment usage to determine bridge and road load restrictions and related traffic control.
- 21. Vehicles on park grass are strictly prohibited without prior permission by the Parks Superintendent or designee.
- 22. Please note that all events are responsible to provide additionally desired park tables and receptacles beyond what is standardly available and in place within City Parks. Additional tables, trash cans, trash bags, servicing of trash cans and removal of event related trash, event fencing, hoses, etc. must be provided by the event applicant. Events are also not allowed to move park furniture and receptacles in order to fulfill additional needs by the event.
- 23. Upon completion of event, all areas associated with the event will be cleaned up. All permanent Park trash receptacles must have trash removed by the event and bags replaced the day of the event. All park grounds that see event crowds must be inspected by the event for any trash, litter, temporary event signs, etc., which must be removed the day of the event before park closing hours. Needed additional trash or debris cleanup by Parks staff will be billed to the event for reimbursement.

Any temporary signs placed along the event must be at least 2' away from the edge of the trail and must be removed the day of the event.
- 25. Construction: In case of an emergency construction project, route may need to be revised; Traffic Engineering will work with the applicant.
- 26. If applicant alters the above route or intends to use a different route, a separate event application approval may be required with the new route detailed.
- 27. The City reserves the right to revoke or alter approval for any event date and/or route based upon a continuing evaluation of items including but not limited to safety, parking, traffic concerns, noise levels, etc., related to the event site and operation; or flood issues, conflicting street construction or other elements deemed hazardous to event attendees.

28. Applicant agrees to defend, indemnify, and save the City of Cedar Rapids harmless from all liability and place on file with the City Manager's Office, a certificate of liability insurance with policy limits satisfactory to the City Council naming the City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and its employees as additional insured, insuring against any liability that may arise in connection with the activities held

Under normal circumstances property owners receive a "Notice of Abatement" letter which allows them seven (7) days to correct the problem identified in the letter and its attachments. If a property owner fails to abate the nuisance, the Solid Waste and Recycling Division abates the nuisance and issues an invoices for services rendered.

Property owners have 30 days to pay their invoice. Failure to pay the invoice results in an "Intent to Assess" action against the property being prepared by the Solid Waste and Recycling Division and presented to City Council in the form of a Resolution.

Following the approval of the Intent to Assess Resolution, the property owner receives another mailing, which includes all the original documentation and a copy of the Intent to Assess Resolution. The property owner then has an additional 30 day period to pay their invoice. Failure to pay the outstanding invoice following the second 30 day period results in a "Levy Assessment" action against the property being prepared by the Solid Waste and Recycling Division and presented to City Council in the form of a Resolution.

Following approval of the "Special Assessment" Resolution, the nuisance abatement information is turned over to the Linn County Treasurer and the outstanding payment is levied against the property owner's taxes for collection.

Action/Recommendation:

The Solid Waste and Recycling Division recommends that the Resolution for the Intent to Assess be approved.





Background:

The Water Pollution Control Facility (WPCF) was constructed in 1980. Waste flow from processes within the plant is returned to the head of the Plant via the Return Sewer line (approx. 3,000 LF). Many of the streams directed through the Return Sewer contain high dissolved sulfides, leading to high H_2S concentrations. Manholes along the Return Sewer are showing considerable levels of corrosion, but the condition of the reinforced concrete pipe is not known.

The Anaerobic Pretreatment (AP) System at the WPCF was constructed in 1999 to treat waste streams from the International Paper (formerly Cedar River Paper) and the Danisco – DuPont (formerly Genencor) facilities. Conveyance facilities were also constructed in 1999 to transport flows from these industries to the AP system. The new conveyance facilities included the Indian Creek Lift Station, 6,000 LF of force main, and 22,500 LF of gravity sewer. 13,500 LF of the gravity sewer was repurposed from the previously abandoned Otis Road Interceptor. In 2006 an addition was made to the Anaerobic gravity sewer to connect the JRA Pharma facility. Another connection was later made to this addition to allow flow from select Danisco – DuPont processes to discharge to this line.

Corrosion to elements of the AP System has been expedited by the high strength waste discharged from the upstream industries; manholes in this area have deteriorated at a much faster rate than those in other portions of the plant. Strand Associates, Inc. performed an evaluation of select manholes at the WPCF in 2015 to determine a long term rehabilitation or replacement option capable of resisting the elevated H_2S concentrations within the sewer.

The objective of the Project is:

- The replacement or rehabilitation of 7 manholes serving the AP System within the WPCF. The method of replacement or rehabilitation of the manholes will be selected to provide a high level of H₂S resistance.
- Cleaning and Televising of the gravity sewer portion of the 1999 Anaerobic Conveyance Facilities and the primary lines serving WPCF Return Sewer (approx. 25,500 LF in total). The work will be accompanied by a report documenting the condition, recommended repairs, and associated cost estimates.

Six engineering firms were contacted for Statements of Qualifications to perform the design. Packets detailing the experience of the firm and the proposed schedule for the project were received from five engineering firms. The five firms were: McClure Engineering Company, HDR Inc., Hall & Hall Engineers, Inc., MSA Professional Services, Inc., and Strand Associates, Inc. The Utilities Department staff evaluated the qualifications of the responding firms and determined that the technical resources that Strand Associates, Inc. could bring to the project best met the needs of the Utilities Department.

Action/Recommendation:

The Utilities Department – WPC division recommends approval of the Professional Services Agreement with Strand Associates, Inc. for the WPCF Sewer Inspection & Repairs project and that the City Manager and City Clerk be authorized to execute said Agreement.

Background:

The Resolution authorizes a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Neighborhood Development Corporation of Cedar Rapids, Inc. (NDC). On April 12, 2016 City Council adopted Resolution No. 0410-04-16 which approved City funding to the NDC subject to an agreement with NDC.

The MOA provides three \$50,000 grants, totaling \$150,000, which are paid in three consecutive fiscal years 2017-2019. Funds are being paid from tax increment funds resulting from NDC's projects which are located within the Consolidated Central Urban Renewal Area.

Agreement as to the terms and conditions of the MOA has been reached with NDC. The following are highlights of the MOA:

- 1. NDC is to provide the City with a long term strategy and business plan that aligns with the City goals, vision, and neighborhood plans.
- 2. Undertake redevelopment projects exclusively within the Consolidated Central and Central Business Urban Renewal Area.
- 3. Provide redevelopment activities in underserved or distressed areas of the community including: property acquisition, catalytic investment, rehabilitation, new construction, and gap financing for public/private projects.
- Coordinate efforts with other stakeholders and partners to attract office, retail, and housing developers to the City's core neighborhoods and assist with leveraging local, state and federal resources.
- 5. Work to be certified by the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) as a Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO).

In January of 2009 the City Council directed staff to pursue establishing a nonprofit neighborhood development corporation based on successful national models to aid in the redevelopment of flood impacted and other core neighborhoods of the City. In March 2009 the City Council accepted the Articles of Incorporation and By-laws of the NDC and established a public-private partnership.

Background:

The City has received a request from the Housing Fund for Linn County (HFfLC) to assist with \$24,000 in matching funds needed to secure a grant of up to \$347,910 in funding from the State Housing Trust Fund program administered by the Iowa Finance Authority (IFA). The HFfLC is a community based non-profit agency with a mission of improving quality of life by offering innovative and flexible funding to expand housing opportunities in Linn County. The organization has been certified as a Local Housing Trust by IFA since 2007.

The HFfLC provides grants or loans to qualifying projects that create affordable housing to projects in Linn County. In most years, loan repayment is sufficient to provide the required local matching funds, however this year a gap exists if the organization is to receive the maximum award. If the MOA is approved, City match would be provided from residual Community Disaster Grant Affordable Housing Gap Funds with the following terms:

- 1. HFfLC will award the City's matching funds as pass through funds only to qualifying projects within the corporate limits of Cedar Rapids.
- 2. HFfLC will coordinate with City staff to ensure projects receiving funds meet applicable standards, meet a market need, and are consistent with City plans and goals.
- 3. HFfLC will provide periodic performance reports to the City.
- 4. HFfLC will ensure funds are used for projects meeting a replacement housing need within the City in compliance with the terms of the funding source.

Local match must be secured in order for HFfLC to meet IFA's application deadline for the State Housing Trust Fund Program by October 3, 2016.

Background:

The resolution for City Council consideration provides for the execution of Development Agreements with the above listed developer and associated properties through the fourth round of the Single Family New Construction Program, known locally as the ROOTs program. The City and developer are ready to execute the Development Agreement to allow construction on the home to begin. To date, 103 such agreements for privately-owned property have been executed for the fourth round of the ROOTs program.

Highlights of the terms and conditions contained in the Development Agreements are as follows:

- a. Developer agrees to commence construction within 30 days of execution of the Agreement, and complete construction by November 30, 2016;
- b. Developer is responsible to resolve conflicts with adjacent property owners and purchasers that might result from the construction project;
- c. Developer is responsible for maintaining the property in accordance with all City and State codes:
- d. Developer shall comply with all program requirements pertaining to the sale of the property to a qualified buyer.

On October 8, 2013, by Resolution No. 1591-10-13, the City Council approved the Administrative Plan for the fourth round of the Single Family New Construction (SFNC) Program; and,

On March 12, 2015, by Resolution No. 0336-03-15, the City Council approved Amendment No. 2 to the Administrative Plan for the fourth round of the Single Family New Construction (SFNC) Program. The modifications to the administrative plan allow for development in Tiers 1, 2, and 3 under the following circumstances:

- Builders will be eligible to be allocated a maximum of 1 unit outside Tier 1 for every unit
 they have constructed in a previous program round. Actual allocation outside Tier 1 will
 be subject to application review and funding availability.
- Shovel readiness will receive scoring consideration.
- The order of priority for allocation will be lots in Tier 1, followed by lots in Tier 2, with lots in Tier 3 receiving the lowest point value for location.
- Ongoing process for reallocation of lots that do not move forward to ensure full expenditure of grant resources.

Through a competitive proposal process, developers submitted applications for the program which listed "preference sites". These sites include City-owned being acquired through the Voluntary Property Acquisition Program and privately-owned property. A team of City staff and neighborhood representatives evaluated the proposals based on:

- financial and performance capacity;
- experience with projects of similar scope;
- architectural design;
- compatibility with the existing neighborhood;
- green building practices; and
- · marketing plan.

A total of 196 properties have been identified by 22 developers in the current phase of property allocation for this program.





Background:

The Low Lift Pump Station off J Avenue at one time pumped surface water from the Cedar River to the J Avenue Water Treatment Plant. For decades, the lift station served as the main source of water for the City of Cedar Rapids. Starting in the 1960's, the alluvial well fields next to the river replaced surface water as the primary source of water for the City. The wells pump water directly to the J Avenue Water Treatment Plant. The Low Lift Pump Station has been completely out of service since 1988. Leaks in the piping have caused flooding in the lower level of the Low Lift Pump Station, adding to the degradation of the building. The Low Lift Pump Station is intended for eventual demolition, and to prepare for this future work and to minimize the risk of leaks and flooding in the interim, the Utilities Department plans to disconnect the existing 30-inch raw water main from the structure and route a new pipe line around it.

The new section of raw water main will connect to the existing raw water main to the west of the Low Lift Pump Station and will be bored and jacked under the Union Pacific Railroad track along Long Bluff Road. From there it will parallel Long Bluff Road until it reconnects with the existing raw water main near the entrance to Mohawk Park. An additional connection will be installed further east so that either of the existing raw water intake mains that cross the river at Mohawk Park can be taken out of service if necessary. The work will require shutdown of a section of Long Bluff Road, but the entrance to Mohawk Park will remain open throughout the project to maintain access to the boat ramp and park pavilion.

The Engineer's original opinion of probable cost was \$670,000 at the time of filing. Additional scope items were added by addendum to the project to ensure that the raw water lines crossing underneath the river near Mohawk Park could be completely isolated as needed during construction. Five 24-inch to 30-inch buried valves on the south side of the river that are worn or were found to be inoperable when tested were added to the project to be replaced. Removals of two large valves (24-inch and 30-inch) that are no longer needed on the north side of the river were also added. The Engineer's updated opinion of probable cost including these items was \$1,040,000 and this amount was published in the addendum.







- A. Adopt Preliminary Assessment without Amendment (Go to Reso #6)

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

Background:

In 2012 the "When Children are Present" plaques were removed from the school speed zone assemblies and flashers with "When Flashing" plaques were installed in order to provide a more definite time period of which the school speed zones were in effect. This made the school speed zones enforceable. Recently, the manufacturer of the flashers has notified the entities that have purchased these flasher devices that the 2G network with which the schedules were uploaded to the devices has been phased out of the area completely. The warranty period on the flashers has expired and now retrofit kits to upgrade to the 4G-LTE network are required to be purchased for all the primary flashers at \$875/unit in order to upload the schedules. The City currently has 19 primary flasher units, which would be a cost about \$17,000. In addition, the City would now have to pay an annual reporting fee of a minimum of \$2,300 (which was not charged in the previous years). The Traffic Engineering Division has been exploring other options, one such option would be to remove the flashers and install time period and days of the week plaques instead. Research has shown that there is little difference in speed compliance between the time period plaques and the flashers. The cost to change out the flashers to the time period plaques would be under \$1000.

Action/Recommendation:

The Public Works Department recommends approval of the odinance change allowing the school speed limit zones to be enforceable with time limit plaques with i.e. "7:30-8:30 AM; 3:00-4:00 PM" as well as a "Monday – Friday" plaque beneath the 25 MPH Speed Limit sign.

Purchase the 4G-LTE retrofit kits which cost \$17,000 plus a minimum of \$2,300 in annual data reporting costs.

ORDINANCE NO. LEG_NUM_TAG

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 61 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA, BY ADDING A SECTION DEFINING TIME PERIOD OF WHICH A SCHOOL SPEED ZONE MAY BE ENFORCED

Section 1. That Section 61.029 of Chapter 61 of the Municipal Code of the City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, is hereby amended by the deletion of Section 61.029 and the addition of a new Section 61.029 as follows:

61.029 SPEED RESTRICTIONS.

- (a) Any person driving a motor vehicle on a street shall drive the same at a careful and prudent speed not greater than nor less than is reasonable and proper, having due regard to the traffic, surface and width of the street and of any other conditions then existing, and no person shall drive any vehicle upon a street at a speed greater than will permit him to bring it to a stop within the assured clear distance ahead, such driver having the right to assume, however, that all persons using said street will observe the law.
- (b) The following shall be the lawful speed limit, except as otherwise modified in this chapter and any speed in excess thereof shall be unlawful:
 - 1. 10 miles per hour on Transit Way SE between 4th and 5th Avenue SE and on all public alleys within the corporate limits of the city of Cedar Rapids.
 - 2. 25 miles per hour in any school zone (as defined in this Chapter) posted with signs reading "25 mph" and "When Flashing" whenever the beacon associated with those signs are flashing.
 - 3. 25 miles per hour in any school zone (as defined in this Chapter) posted with signs reading "25 mph" and a sign depicting the time period and day of the week the speed limit is to be in effect.
 - 4. 25 miles per hour on all streets within the corporate limits of the city of Cedar Rapids unless otherwise stated in this section.
 - 5. 15 miles per hour on the following streets:

Section 2. Separability of Provisions. It is the intention of the Council that each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, and provision of the Ordinance is separable, and, if any provision is held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance nor any part thereof than that affected by such decision.

Section 4. That the afore described Amended Subsection of Chapter 61 shall be included as part of the replacement pages of the Municipal Code, City of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and made a part of said Code as provided by law.

Section 5. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
