


Issue #5: Signs

Description of Issue

As part of ReZone Cedar Rapids, the City wants to provide rules that make sense based on the various unique areas of the city. For example, regulations that work along Blairs Ferry Road might not be appropriate along 3rd Street SE in downtown and NewBo. This is true for signage. Signs can enhance the existing character of our many diverse neighborhoods and are a way to effectively identify businesses and organizations. However, excessively large signs and certain types of signs can negatively impact our community. Therefore, it is important to explore some possible approaches to enhance the positive aspects of signs and temper the negative.
