NUISANCE PROPERTY UPDATE

Since October 1, 2013 there have been **3,011** Founded Calls for Service of Chapter 22A which have affected **2,135** properties. Of the 22A Founded Calls for Service, **408** have met the threshold of 22A and have been deemed Nuisance Properties since the program started. Since October 1, 2014, **278** Nuisance Properties have been brought back into compliance. Of the **2,227** Tier C Founded Calls for Service, only **105** have resulted in a Nuisance Property Designation. SAFE-CR has billed **\$41,977.49** for Police Calls for Service and has collected **\$17,089.58**.

Based upon the following charts and graphs, property owners are abating the nuisance after they receive a Call for Service letter. Only **4.7%** of Tier C violations have risen to a Nuisance Property Designation and only **13.7%** of Nuisance Properties have had additional 22A violations billed.



Update-

Due to a recent retirement, the Police Department felt it necessary to review our standard practice of addressing inquires in terms of public records.

Police Department employees do not have the capability of releasing call for service notes and/or police supplements to callers over the phone due to confidentiality protocol. Therefore, employees will direct the caller to make a formal request for records to maintain compliance with confidentiality rules and regulations. Police employees are still able to provide information provided on the arrest report and call for service log over the phone. All other inquiries from the public regarding landlord/tenant issues, housing or other nuisance activity, will be routed to SAFE-CR.

In reviewing this process we have eliminated confusion, streamlined the steps involved, and improved customer service.








The pie charts below show Nuisance Activity categorized by each tier of 22A.03 separated by month from 7-22-2015 to 7-22-2016.







NUISANCE ACTIVITY






Nuisance Activity Statistics for NE Quadrant






Top: Shows Nuisance Properties in NE Quadrant by Type of Activity 7-22-15 to 7-22-16




Bottom Right: Shows Nuisance Properties in NE Quadrant by Month 7-22-15 to 7-22-16






Top: Nuisance Property broken down by violation occurring in the Northwest Quadrant 7-22-15 to 7-22-16






Top: Nuisance Activity broken down by activity type occurring in the Southeast Quadrant 7-22-15 to 7-22-16






Top: Nuisance Property broken down by violation occurring in the Southeast Quadrant 7-22-15 to 7-22-16






Top: Nuisance Activity broken down by activity type occurring in the Southwest Quadrant 7-22-15 to 7-22-16















BACKGROUND CHECKS

The number of background checks requested through RentPrep has remained fairly consistent over the past several months. In July, 74 background checks were conducted. These checks were ordered by a total of 34 registered landlords with the City of Cedar Rapids. Overall, there have been 4,162 background checks ordered by 410 landlords. The background checks consist of a 50-state criminal history search, active Iowa warrants, Cedar Rapids arrests, as well as checks of the National Sex Offender Registry and the National Terrorist List.

Landlords also have the option to order additional screenings including Social Security Verification, Eviction Histories, and Lien/Bankruptcy Histories. 24 of the 74 (32.43%) background checks in July 2016 included these additional screens and 1,224 of the 4,165 (29.39%) total background checks included them.

30 of the 74 (40.54%) individuals screened in July 2016 yielded at least one reportable hit on their criminal history. Overall, 1,797 of the 4,162 (43.18%) background checks have at least one reportable offense in their criminal history. In accordance with the Fair Credit Reporting Act, a misdemeanor crime is reportable for 7 years and a felony is reportable for the lifetime of the individual.

Overall Statistics

- 50.74% of the prospective tenants currently living in Cedar Rapids yielded a reportable criminal history (1,201 of 2,367)
- 48.23% of the prospective tenants currently living in Linn County yielded a reportable criminal history (1,364 of 2,828)
- 46.01% of the prospective tenants currently living in Iowa yielded a reportable criminal history (1,586 of 3,447)
- 29.81% of the prospective tenants currently living outside of Iowa yielded a reportable criminal history (214 of 718)

The top 5 misdemeanor and felony violations found are shown below. The offenses are broken down by state of arrest, as many states have different qualifications for offenses (i.e. what may be a misdemeanor in one state is a felony in another). All offenses shown below are defined by the Iowa State Code unless otherwise noted.
