




## Status of Open Complaints

# Public Safety and Youth Services Committee: City Diversity Efforts Update

## **Overview:**

### **Issue:**

The City of Cedar Rapids has an opportunity to create an Employee Diversity and Equity Committee and has appointed a Chief Diversity Officer to co-lead and support citywide diversity and inclusion efforts.

**EnvisionCR Element/Goal:** ProtectCR Goal 3: Maintain and provide quality services to the community.

### **City of Cedar Rapids Vision Statement:**

*Cedar Rapids is a vibrant urban hometown – a beacon for people and businesses invested in building a greater community now and for the next generation.*

## **Background:**

- The City of Cedar Rapids has long worked to promote diversity through hiring a diverse workforce and making sure that our work environment is welcoming.
- The City has conducted city-wide trainings on anti-harassment, diversity and inclusion, and dignity and respect, all of which are related to promoting a diverse and welcoming workplace.

## Background:

- Many public sector organizations have developed diversity programming, supportive committees, and executive positions to guide their diversity efforts.
  - **Ex:** Linn County, City of Iowa City, City of Dubuque, City of South Bend, City of New York, and others.
- As of August 19, 2015 through a Service Agreement between the City of Cedar Rapids and the Cedar Rapids Civil Rights Commission (CRCRC), CRCRC Executive Director LaSheila Yates began serving as the City's Chief Diversity Officer.
- The CRCRC Executive Director is working in partnership with the Human Resources Director, Conni Huber, and serves as a co-advisor to the City Manager on issues related to diversity, equity, and inclusion.

## Timeline:

- **March 27, 2015** - 1st Local Government Agencies Diversity Initiatives group meeting (Linn County Human Resources, City of Cedar Rapids Human Resources, Cedar Rapids Civil Rights Commission, and the Cedar Rapids Community School District)
- **August 19, 2015** - A Service Agreement is established between the City of Cedar Rapids and the Cedar Rapids Civil Rights Commission, whereas CRCRC Executive Director LaSheila Yates began serving as the City's Chief Diversity Officer
- **September 16, 2015** - Cedar Rapids Community School District presents its 1<sup>st</sup> District Diversity Dashboard at the CRCRC meeting
- **September - October 2015** - Chief Diversity Officer Yates holds listening tours with Department Directors and submits Diversity Climate Survey to Senior Management for feedback

## **Timeline:**

- **November 19, 2015** – Human Resources Director Conni Huber and Chief Diversity Officer Yates conduct presentations regarding the City’s new Diversity and Inclusion Initiative
- **December 2015** - City of Cedar Rapids received a Municipal Equality Index Score of 99 out of 100 for the 2015 Human Rights Campaign
- **December 2015 – June 2016** CRPD Recruitment Staff, HR, and Chief Diversity Officer Yates hold ongoing diversity recruitment strategy meetings
- **February 2016** - City receives designation as a Home Base Iowa Business, supporting veterans entering and reentering the workforce
- **March 10, 2016** - The City held its Employee Diversity Kickoff Meeting and shared Diversity Climate Survey results with the group

## **Timeline:**

- **March 23, 2016** – City Directors participate in an onsite Implicit Bias Training and Education
- **March – June 2016** Employee diversity team establishes a name, regular meeting schedule, and project timeline
- **May 3, 2016** – Employee diversity team receives and reviews initial City employee demographics (turnover rate and employees eligible for retirement)
- **May 16 2016** - Initiated City-wide employee awareness about the new Diversity and Equity Initiative through the Employee Newsletter
- **June 2016** – Chief Diversity Officer Yates attends a Diversity & Inclusion Strategic Leadership Program hosted by the Society for Human Resource Management in Washington, DC
- **June – July 2016** – Employee diversity team works towards developing meeting expectations, commitments, and purpose

# **Senior Management Feedback: Diversity and Inclusion Climate Survey**

## **Top priorities to best support City diversity and inclusion efforts:**

1. Recruitment strategies designed to help increase organizational diversity - 92%
2. Engagement in community outreach related to diversity - 77%
3. Retention strategies designed to help retain a diverse workforce – 31%
4. Career development opportunities designed to increase diversity in higher-level positions within the organization - 31%

# **Senior Management Feedback: Diversity and Inclusion Climate Survey**

## **The top three most important outcomes:**

1. Diversity evident at all levels of the workforce (e.g., rank-and-file to senior management) – 69%
2. Number of diverse employees recruited – 62%
3. Employee opinion surveys/diversity audits - 46%



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


## Juvenile Arrests at Schools



# PUBLIC SAFETY UPDATE

## *NUISANCE PROPERTY UPDATE*

Since October 1, 2013 there have been **2,935** Founded Calls for Service of Chapter 22A which have affected **2,080** properties. Of the 22A Founded Calls for Service, **390** have met the threshold of 22A and have been deemed Nuisance Properties since the program started. Since October 1, 2014, **270** Nuisance Properties have been brought back into compliance. Of the **2,167** Tier C Founded Calls for Service, only **103** have resulted in a Nuisance Property Designation. SAFE-CR has billed **\$41,888.19** for Police Calls for Service and has collected **\$16,143.94**.

Based upon the following charts and graphs, property owners are abating the nuisance after they receive a Call for Service letter. Only **4.8%** of Tier C violations have risen to a Nuisance Property Designation and only **14.1%** of Nuisance Properties have had additional 22A violations billed.







### NUISANCE ACTIVITY






## Nuisance Activity Statistics for NE Quadrant






**Top:** Shows Nuisance Properties in NE Quadrant by Type of Activity 6-24-15 to 6-24-16






**Top:** Nuisance Activity broken down by activity type occurring in the Southwest Quadrant 6-24-15 to 6-24-16



## BACKGROUND CHECKS

The number of background checks requested through RentPrep has remained fairly consistent over the past several months. In June, 113 background checks were conducted. These checks were ordered by a total of 35 registered landlords with the City of Cedar Rapids. Overall, there have been 4,019 background checks ordered by 408 landlords. The background checks consist of a 50-state criminal history search, active Iowa warrants, Cedar Rapids arrests, as well as checks of the National Sex Offender Registry and the National Terrorist List.

Landlords also have the option to order additional screenings including Social Security Verification, Eviction Histories, and Lien/Bankruptcy Histories. 55 of the 113 (48.67%) background checks in June 2016 included these additional screens and 1,169 of the 4,019 (29.09%) total background checks included them.

45 of the 113 (39.82%) individuals screened in June 2016 yielded at least one reportable hit on their criminal history. Overall, 1,741 of the 4,019 (43.32%) background checks have at least one reportable offense in their criminal history. In accordance with the Fair Credit Reporting Act, a misdemeanor crime is reportable for 7 years and a felony is reportable for the lifetime of the individual.

### Overall Statistics

- 50.79% of the prospective tenants currently living in Cedar Rapids yielded a reportable criminal history (1,161 of 2,286)
- 48.36% of the prospective tenants currently living in Linn County yielded a reportable criminal history (1,325 of 2,740)
- 46.22% of the prospective tenants currently living in Iowa yielded a reportable criminal history (1,534 of 3,319)
- 29.57% of the prospective tenants currently living outside of Iowa yielded a reportable criminal history (207 of 700)

The top 5 misdemeanor and felony violations found are shown below. The offenses are broken down by state of arrest, as many states have different qualifications for offenses (i.e. what may be a misdemeanor in one state is a felony in another). All offenses shown below are defined by the Iowa State Code unless otherwise noted.
