April 2016 Quarterly Participant Report**

Background Information

The Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Program is funded through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and administered locally by the City of Cedar Rapids Housing Services Division. The purpose of the program is to provide monthly payments on behalf of the tenant, to the landlord to assist the household with their rent.

Update: On February 11, 2015 the waiting list opened to accept pre-applications to the Section 8 HCV program. Approximately six weeks later, 1,200 pre-applications were accepted, and the waiting list was closed. There are approximately 600 applicants currently on the Section 8 waiting list. See Figure 1 for additional information.

Update: On April 13, 2016 the Housing Services Division held its Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program Landlord Orientation. The next orientation is scheduled for August 17, 2016 from 5 p.m. – 6:30 p.m. and is open to anyone with property in Linn or Benton Counties that would like more information on how to participate in this program as a landlord.

Household Income



NUISANCE PROPERTY UPDATE

Since October 1, 2013 there have been **2,726** Founded Calls for Service of Chapter 22A which have affected **1,931** properties. Of the 22A Founded Calls for Service, **376** have met the threshold of 22A and have been deemed Nuisance Properties since the program started. Since October 1, 2014, **252** Nuisance Properties have been brought back into compliance. Of the **2,324** Tier C Founded Calls for Service, only **99** have resulted in a Nuisance Property Designation. SAFE-CR has billed **\$41,653.19** for Police Calls for Service and has collected **\$8,783.74**.

Based upon the following charts and graphs, property owners are abating the nuisance after they receive a Call for Service letter. Only **4.3%** of Tier C violations have risen to a Nuisance Property Designation and only **14.4%** of Nuisance Properties have had additional 22A violations billed.

Tenant Background Checks Review

Chapter 29 mandates that background checks must be completed on all persons 18 years of age or older who newly occupy a rental.

To meet the minimum requirements, a check must be done on Iowa Courts Online, as well as checking the Iowa State and National Sex Offender Registries.

The City offers a comprehensive background check to licensed Cedar Rapids landlords. This \$8.00 background check includes all of the above, as well as the following:

- 50 state criminal background check
- Terrorist database
- Cedar Rapids arrest history
- State of Iowa warrants

The City offered background check service is a reasonably priced, extremely thorough option to consider when screening possible tenants. Each City offered background check is performed manually on an individual basis. The City's detailed checks can uncover discrepancies such as duplicate social security numbers, hyphenated names, aliases, misspellings, etc.



This provides an additional degree of information for landlords, thus allowing them to make better informed decisions in regard to tenants. These decisions may ultimately lead to the possibility of retaining current renters longer, avoidance of being deemed a nuisance property, tenants who pay rent responsibly, tenants who will take care of property, and ultimately be a good neighbor to others.

*Background checks have increased 27% from April 2015 to April 2016.





The pie charts below show Nuisance Activity categorized by each tier of 22A.03 separated by month from 4-21-2015 to 4-21-2016.







NUISANCE ACTIVITY






Nuisance Activity Statistics for NE Quadrant






Top: Shows Nuisance Properties in NE Quadrant by Type of Activity 4-21-15 to 4-21-16

Bottom Left: Shows Nuisance Properties in NE Quadrant by Tier 4-21-15 to 4-21-16




Bottom Right: Shows Nuisance Properties in NE Quadrant by Month 4-21-15 to 4-21-16






Top: Nuisance Property broken down by violation occurring in the Northwest Quadrant 4-21-15 to 4-21-16






Top: Nuisance Activity broken down by activity type occurring in the Southeast Quadrant 4-21-15 to 4-21-16






Top: Nuisance Property broken down by violation occurring in the Southeast Quadrant 4-21-15 to 4-21-16




Bottom Right: Number of Nuisance Property per month in the Southeast Quadrant 4-21-15 to 4-21-16












In March 2014, 100% of Nuisance Properties were In Compliance.






In May 2014, 83% of Nuisance Properties were In Compliance.




In June 2014, 93% of Nuisance Properties were In Compliance.




In July 2014, 92% of Nuisance Properties were In Compliance.







BACKGROUND CHECKS

The number of background checks requested through RentPrep has remained fairly consistent over the past several months. In April, 104 background checks were conducted. These checks were ordered by a total of 40 registered landlords with the City of Cedar Rapids. Overall, there have been 3,711 background checks ordered by 399 landlords. The background checks consist of a 50-state criminal history search, active Iowa warrants, Cedar Rapids arrests, as well as checks of the National Sex Offender Registry and the National Terrorist List.

Landlords also have the option to order additional screenings including Social Security Verification, Eviction Histories, and Lien/Bankruptcy Histories. 44 of the 104 (42.31%) background checks in April 2016 included these additional screens and 1,051 of the 3,711 (28.32%) total background checks included them.

40 of the 104 (38.46%) individuals screened in April 2016 yielded at least one reportable hit on their criminal history. Overall, 1,605 of the 3,711 (43.25%) background checks have at least one reportable offense in their criminal history. In accordance with the Fair Credit Reporting Act, a misdemeanor crime is reportable for 7 years and a felony is reportable for the lifetime of the individual.

Overall Statistics

- 50.68% of the prospective tenants currently living in Cedar Rapids yielded a reportable criminal history (1,074 of 2,119)
- 48.15% of the prospective tenants currently living in Linn County yielded a reportable criminal history (1,220 of 2,534)
- 45.99% of the prospective tenants currently living in Iowa yielded a reportable criminal history (1,410 of 3,066)
- 30.23% of the prospective tenants currently living outside of Iowa yielded a reportable criminal history (195 of 645)

The top 5 misdemeanor and felony violations found are shown below. The offenses are broken down by state of arrest, as many states have different qualifications for offenses (i.e. what may be a misdemeanor in one state is a felony in another). All offenses shown below are defined by the Iowa State Code unless otherwise noted.




Juvenile Arrests at Schools


