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| General Statement of Duties |
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Provides technical maintenance and work leadership services to a parks and recreation maintenance program.

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| Distinguishing Features of the Class |
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Works under general supervision with some discretion in selection of work method and schedule. May receive work direction in the field from employees in the classification of Recreation Maintenance-Repair Worker II.

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| Examples of Essential Work (Illustrative Only) |
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Performs ongoing maintenance on swimming pools including opening and shut down processes, chemical feed systems and back- washing; provides backup maintenance support for Bender Pool;
 Performs a variety of moderately difficult maintenance and repair tasks involving carpentry, plumbing, welding, cement finishing, HVAC, boilers, and electrical installation and repair in parks and recreation facilities;
 Oversees and participates in painting projects; paints buildings, swimming pools and equipment, using brush, roller, compressed air and airless sprayer;
 Performs general mechanical maintenance on equipment;
 Performs related park playground maintenance, playground safety inspections, repairs, parts ordering and inspection and asset data entry management, as needed;
 Performs maintenance in winter sports areas including snowplowing, spraying and planing ice rinks, grooming cross-country ski trails, maintaining toboggan runs and shoveling snow;
 Lays out athletic fields, including measuring and installing base pegs, etc.;
 Drives truck to haul equipment, supplies and debris;
 Operates riding and push mowers and trimming equipment;
 Maintains water and irrigation systems, backflow systems, and water playgrounds;
 Operates two-way radio;
 Wears and properly uses safety equipment including personal protective, fall protection equipment, self-contained breathing apparatus and gas detection equipment;

Performs all work duties and activities in accordance with City policies, procedures and safety practices;
Attends work regularly at the designated place and time;
Supports continuous process improvement initiatives;
Performs related work as required.

Required Knowledge and Abilities

Good knowledge of general maintenance and repair methods and techniques as applied to buildings and grounds and mechanical equipment;
Good knowledge of the methods and procedures for the maintenance of pools;
Good knowledge of recirculation, backwash, chemical controller/feeder systems;
Good knowledge of water chemistry;
Good knowledge of the methods and procedures for seasonal pool opening and closing and related facilities;
Knowledge of OSHA permit-required confined space entry protocol, respiratory protection standards, right-to-know laws, CPR and First Aid;
Skill in a variety of specified maintenance and repair tasks;
Ability to properly utilize the following equipment and tools: tractors, mowers, dump trucks, power tools, mechanical hand tools, electric arc and acetylene welding equipment, compressed air and airless paint sprayers, sandblaster, voltmeter, air hammer, personal protective equipment, gas detectors, fall protection equipment and self-contained breathing apparatus;
Ability to work under general supervision and exercise considerable discretion in selection of work method and schedule;
Ability to work cooperatively and to maintain effective working relationships to accomplish job responsibilities;
Ability to quickly learn and put to use new skills and knowledge brought about by rapidly changing information and/or technology;
Ingenuity and inventiveness in the performance of assigned tasks.

Acceptable Experience and Training

Graduation from High School or GED; and
Minimum of three years work experience in maintenance and repair work requiring a wide variety of skills, equipment and tools; or
Any equivalent combination of experience and training which provides the knowledge and abilities necessary to perform the work.

Required Special Qualifications

Essential Physical Abilities
